

## How Is Viability Determined?

In order to be entitled to elect delegates to the county convention, groups must have a certain minimum number of eligible caucus attendees in their group.

There can be no more viable preference groups than there are delegates to elect from a particular precinct. If there are, the smallest groups must re-align until the # of groups equals the # of delegates to elect from that precinct.

### Caucus Math

#### Caucuses which elect

one (1) delegate

No groups may form, the delegate must be elected by the whole caucus

#### Caucuses which elect

two (2) delegates

Viable groups must contain 25% of attendees (# eligible attendees X .25)

#### Caucuses which elect

three (3) delegates

Viable groups must contain 1/6th of attendees (# eligible attendees, divided by 6)

#### Caucuses which elect

four (4) or more delegates

Viable groups must contain 15% of attendees (# eligible attendees X .15)

\*Round all fractions UP to a whole number when determining viability

- Any preference group that is not viable must be given time to realign with preference groups that are viable or with another preference group that is also not viable.
